

Subject Guide Economic Development

Economic development is a process and refers to the pathways through which the material well-being of people, living in a nation, a region and/or a community, improves over time.

Material well-being here references a broad range of factors such as education, health, living standards, income, and quality of life. Though economic development may be achieved through economic growth, the two terms are not synonymous. Economic growth focuses on monetary indicators such as national income. Economic development, on the other hand, is a broader concept that brings together increasing incomes with progressive changes in social, economic, cultural and political parameters. At IIHS, our teaching, research and practice on economic development issues are uniquely differentiated by:

- Interdisciplinary and heterodox approaches to enrich economic development studies (including economic history, economic sociology, economic geography, planning, finance, management, labour studies, and law and governance).
- An interest in place, people, institutions, infrastructure, scale and spatiality to understand economic development.

 An interest in centring questions pertaining to urbanisation, informality, welfare, sustainable resource consumption and sustainable development into studies of economic development, to bring into focus challenges of Southern urban futures and the economic, social and environmental transitions involved.

Search tips

Boolean operators:

- AND: Results contain all search terms.
- OR: Results contain at least one search term.
- NOT: Results do not contain the search terms.

Example: The search 'pets AND dogs' finds items that contain both pets and dogs. The search 'pets OR dogs' finds items that contain either pets or items that contain dogs. The search 'pets NOT dogs' finds items that contain pets but do not contain dogs.
